

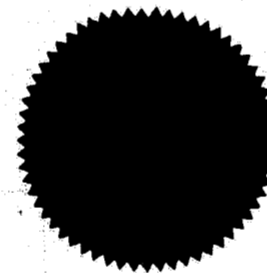
**Department of State**

I Certify That, satisfactory evidence having been exhibited of the appointment of Philip W. Pillsbury as Consular Agent of France with air honorary status at St. Louis, Missouri Consulate General at St. Louis, Missouri, the President of the United States of America has ordered his recognition as such officer, declaring him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers, and privileges as are allowed to the honorary Consular Agents of the most favored Nations in the United States.
