Proposed Amendment by Board of
Freeholders to Section 333 of the
Charter of the City of Stillwater re-
lating, among other things, to the
levying of taxes for all school pur-
poses.

Stillwater Minnesota,
June 10, 1918.
To Honorable J. E. Kollner, Mayor of
the City of Stillwater:

The Board of Freeholders, of which
the undersigned members constitute
a majority, appointed by the District
Court of Washington County, Minne-
sota, and duly authorized by law to
propose amendments to the Charter of
the City of Stillwater, hereby proposes
that Section 333 of the Charter of the
City of Stillwater, be and is hereby
amended, so that said Section 333 shall
read as follows:

333. Taxation.—The Board of
Education is hereby authorized
and empowered to levy upon the
taxable property of the City each
and every year such taxes as will
raise sufficient sums of money for
all school purposes of every char-
acter whatsoever, including money
for the purchase, construction, and
repair of school buildings and also
money to defray the expenses
incident to the maintenance
thereof; and also such sums
as will provide for the prompt
payment of all indebtedness
of said district, provided that
the aggregate annual amount shall
not exceed in any year twenty-
three mills on the dollar upon the
assessed valuation of said district,
unless the Council of the City of
Stillwater shall approve the same
by a majority vote. The Board of
Education shall make and return
its annual levy of taxes on or be-
fore the first day of September of
each year to the County Auditor
of the County of Washington, and
such taxes shall be collected and
the payment thereof enforced in
like manner as state and county
taxes are collected and the pay-
ment thereof enforced, and when
collected shall, together with all
costs, interest, and penalties col-
lected thereon, be turned over by
the County Treasurer to the
Treasurer of said Board, at the
times said County Treasurer is re-
quired to make settlement with
the City Treasurer of the City.

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

THESE PRESENTS HEREBY CERTIFY, That the foregoing draft of a proposed amendment to Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater as duly returned and delivered to the Chief Executive or Chief Magistrate of said City of Stillwater to-wit: its Mayor, J. R. Kollner, by the board of freeholders appointed by the late Hon. P. H. Stolberg, and by the Hon. J. N. Searles, each being respectively at the time of such appointment, Judge of the Nineteenth Judicial District of the State of Minnesota, under and pursuant to the constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota, was duly submitted to the qualified voters of said City of Stillwater at a special election, duly called and held for that purpose only, on the 5th day of August, A. D. 1918, at which said election there were cast in favor of the adoption and ratification of said proposed amendment to Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater two hundred ninety (290) votes out of a total vote of four hundred sixty-two (462) cast at said special election, and at said special election said proposed amendment to Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater did receive the votes of more than three-fifths of the qualified voters voting at said special election in said City in favor of the adoption and ratification thereof, and that all of the votes so cast by the qualified voters at said special election were duly returned and canvassed by the properly and duly authorized and official canvassing board in and for said City of Stillwater, and that said canvassing board after such canvass did duly declare said proposed amendment to said Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater to have been duly adopted.
