The Board of Education shall make and return its annual levy of taxes on or before the first day of September of each year to the County Auditor of the County of Washington, and such taxes shall be collected and the payment thereof enforced, and when collected shall, together with all costs, interest, and penalities collected thereon, be turned over by the County Treasurer to the Treasurer of said Loard, at the times said County Treasurer is required to make settlement with the City Treasurer of the City.

THESE PRESENTS HEREBY CERTIFY, That the foregoing draft of a proposed amendment to Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater as duly returned and delivered to the Chief Executive or Chief Magistrate of said City of Stillwater to-wit: its Mayor, J. R. Kolliner, by the board of freeholders appointed by the late Hom. P. H. Stolberg, and by the Hom. J. N. Searles, each being respectively at the time of such appointment. Judge of the Nineteenth Judicial District of the State of Minnesota, under and pursuant to the constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota, was duly submitted to the qualified veters of said City of Stillwater at a special election, duly called and held for that purpose only, on the 5th day of August, A. D. 1918, at which said election there were cast in favor of the adoption and ratification of said proposed amendment to Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater two hundred ninety (290) votes out of a total vote of four hundred sixty-two (462) cast at said special election, and at said special election said proposed amendment to Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater did receive the votes of more than three-fifths of the qualified voters voting at said special election in said City in favor of the adoption and ratification thereof, and that all of the votes so cast by the qualified voters at said special election were duly returned and convessed by the properly and duly authorized and official canvassing board in and for said City of Stillwater, and that said canvassing board after such canvass did duly declars said proposed amendment to said Section 333 of the Charter of the City of Stillwater to have been duly adopted.
