WHEREAS, the stranded motorist often incurs considerable expense for an emergency service call, and


WHEREAS, the car owner is not aware of the condition of his battery in most cases,

"TEST YOUR BATTERY WEEK"


in Minnesota, and urge that all batteries be checked and serviced before--
