

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, every year millions of motorists find that the worn-out automobile battery that worked fine in the summer months fails them with the arrival of cold weather, and
- WHEREAS, this results in a tremendous loss of productive man hours due to employees being late or absent from work, important appointments missed, and cars stalled on busy thoroughfares of remote areas, and
- WHEREAS, the stranded motorist often incurs considerable expense for an emergency service call, and
- WHEREAS, the car owner is not aware of the condition of his battery in most cases,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 1 - 6, 1967, as

"TEST YOUR BATTERY WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge that all batteries be checked and serviced before ~~not allowing~~ failures occur.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-eighth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State the one hundred tenth.
