WHEREAS, the Nation owes a great debt to the Forest Products Industry for supplying the materials to build our homes, schools, churches, farms, towns and cities throughout three centuries of our history, and

WHEREAS, lumber is our oldest manufacturing industry, dating back to 1608 when the first shipment of clapboards from Jenestown. Virginia Colony, started an American Heritage of industry, and

WHEREAS, forests of the State of Minnesots are one of the great natural resources from which we draw our strength, for our people could not live without a continuous supply of lumber, plywood, pulp, and paper and thousands of other products made from wood, and

WHEREAS, this renewable natural resource contributes greatly to our industrial economy and affords many recreational opportunities and is a definite part of our consideration in conservation programs, thus making Minnesota a batter place in which to live, work and play, and thereby "Wood Works Wonders,"

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LaVender, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 15-22, 1967, as

in Minnesote, and do urge all citizens to participate in ceremonies and observances extelling the great contribution that wood products have made to our way of life.
