PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, twenty-two years ago, on October 24, 1945, the United Nations Charter came into force, and
- WHEREAS, the citizens of this state are fully aware that our survival requires world-wide cooperation, and that this country's highest hopes are in harmony with the hopes and aspirations of peoples everywhere, and
- WHEREAS, the United Nations and its family of agencies has earned the esteem and respect of the citizens of this state and this country for its practical achievements, which directly benefit each one of us in our daily lives, and help us to fulfill the humanitarian obligations which Americans have always tried to serve, and
- WHEREAS, the success of the United Nations depends to a large extent on the good will and support of a well-informed public,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, October 24, 1967, as

"UNITED NATIONS DAY"

in Minnesota, and call upon all citizens of Minnesota to observe that day in a spirit of common purpose with the aims of the United Nations and participate in programs and activities designed to give support and encouragement to effective U. S. participation in the United Nations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-seventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State, the one hundred tenth.
