

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, the quality of life in our Nation's future will be determined largely by the direction given to and character developed by today's youth, and
- WHEREAS, our Nation's schools play a paramount role in defining that direction and shaping that character by endeavoring to realize the potentials of all youth and to create patterns of lifelong learning whereby the challenge of change will be met enthusiastically, and
- WHEREAS, more than 63,000 teachers in Minnesota's public, private and parochial schools from kindergarten through the institutions of higher learning are devoting their total effort toward the betterment of education in our State, and
- WHEREAS, one of the primary duties of an enlightened citizenry must be knowledge of, interest in, and responsibility for the quality of our schools,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of November 5-11, 1967, as

"AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge all residents to examine more closely the existing and projected programs of our schools, as well as their own individual efforts to ensure the highest quality education for all.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State, the one hundred tenth.
