

Notice of Application for the
Survey of an Island.

TAKE NOTICE:

That J. I. Fadum, the undersigned, has made application to the General Land Office of the United States, Washington, D.C. to have a certain island surveyed by the United States Surveyor, in order that the said applicant may enter such lands and obtain title thereto in accordance with laws in such case made and provided. The approximate location of such island is in Vermillion Lake, in Section 30, Township 62 North of Range 15 West of the 4th Principal Meridian. Such island having never been surveyed nor otherwise shown on the records of the office of the United States Land Office.

You are hereby required to file your answer with the Land Commission of the United States Land Office, Washington D.C. within 30 days after receipt of this notice upon each of you and show cause, if any there be, why the said application should not be granted.
