

Notice of Application for the
Survey of an Island.

For the State of Minnesota:

TAKE NOTICE: That J. I. Fadum, the
undersigned, has made application to the General
Land Office of the United States, Washington, D.C.
to have a certain island surveyed by the United
States Surveyor, in order that the said applicant
may enter such land and obtain title thereto in
accordance with laws in such case made and provided.

receipt of this notice upon each of you and show
cause, if any there be, why the said application should
not be granted.
