WHEREAS, the motivation of more young Americans toward careers in science, and the removal of barriers to careers in scientific Sields, are vital in meeting this need for scientific panpower.

THE THE EFORE, I, Harold La Vander, Governor of the State of Hinnesots, do hereby proclaim Sunday, February II, 1968, as

"EDISON SCIENCE YOU'L DAY"

in Ninnescta, and urge the people of this State, and its schools, teachers, parents, industries and divid organizations to encourage youth to take advantage of the great opportunities of modern science and technology.
