WHEREAS, Minnesotans are keenly aware of the contributions made by the Committee on Ophthalmology for the State Medical Association and the Minnesota Lions Club Eye Bank, and

WHEREAS, through the contributions in the establishment and maintenance of a good medical program in the prevention of blindness and in the assistance of those who have been affected by this unfortunate malady, and

WHEREAS, 12,100 Lions Club members take an active part in the establishment of the Eye Bank for the people of Minnesota and being aided by the Department of Ophthalmology at the University of Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, sight can be restored to those individuals who are affected with blindness through the never-ending efforts of the Minnesota Lions Club Eye Bank.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesote, do hereby proclaim the week of March 3 - 9, 1968, as

"EYE BANK WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge Minnesotans to support this effort which is working in the field of prevention of blindness and in the rehabilitation of those previously blinded, pointing rays of new light to those lost in a world of darkness. The State of Minnesota heartily commends the efforts of all those individuals engaged in this worthwhile endeavor.
