This will inform you that on September 13, 1966, the day of the regular Primary Elections, Brooklyn Park also held a Special Election, at which time the following question was presented to the voters:

"Shall Optional Plan B, providing for the Council-Manager form of village government, be adopted for the government of the village?"

The question was passed by a vote of 1,474 to 1,036. Attached is a certified copy of the results, by precinct, and also a sample of the ballot used.

On September 15, 1966, the results of the election were approved by a canvassing board made up of three members of our five-person village council.
