ADOPTED BY THE SOUTH OF THE FIFTH CORPS, A.D.F.

SECTION I: This society sh'll be known and designated as: "SOCIETY OF THE FIFTH COMPS, A. H. F."

SECTION II : PURPOSES AND OF THIS:

The purposes and objects of this Sot toldy shell be: To perpotue to the memories of active service with the Fifth Sop (This Inc.) To promote fraternal feeling a son; the members thereof; To add the sesist all poor and distressed mothers, their vives and children; To help no could for exployment for the members of the Society in the United States; To allelse t such momentoes of service in France as members of the Society may done to make the feelen; To provide markers or monuments at crucial points on the source to the fellen; To provide markers or monuments at crucial points on the source of the Fifth Corps; To publish a memorial containing object the services of the Fifth Corps; To publish anually objects of members who my vertices of the Fifth Corps; To publish anually objects of members who my vertices.

The following qualifications will be organized for numbership in this society:
Any officer, field clork or enlists from of the Army of the United States or of
the Allied Armies, and any officer, it field element or enlisted man honorably separated from the military service of the United States or of the Allied Governments
who has served in any organizations assigned or attached as Corps Troops to the
Fifth Army Corps since July 13th, M. 18th, or value has served in a Division which
has participated in active operations and against the enemy while assigned or attached
to the Fifth Army Corps, during who dehoperations casualties have been sustained
in such Division, or who has served in a Division which for a period of sixty
(60) days has been assigned to the Height Army Corps in a training area, shall be
eligible to membership in this souther.

SECTION IV: FORM OF ORGANN LEMOSI:
The officers of this Society shall wooms! St of the following: Not to exceed five Honorary Presidents; a President; Novice-President; Secretary; Registrar; Treasurer, and a Historian. Of the above now sold officers the President and Secretary and Treasurer and two other non-office co-coulding anothers of the Society appointed by the President, Secretary and Treasurers, shall constitute an Executive Committee, with authority to make final decisions upon qualifications for membership in addition to such other duties as are perfectly prescribed.

SECTION V: DUTIES OF OFMICHS AND THE EXECUTIVE COLLECTIVE:

The officers of the Society sixil properties the ordinary duties incident to and have the powers pertaining to their respective offices as commonly understood in private corporations.

The Registrar shall keep the MATMULEL POSters of the various organizations which formed a part of the Fifth MyVIV 10 mps and a roster of the members of this Society.

The Treasurer shall have custoff of all the funds of the Society, shall give bond in such amount and with such artheries as shall be fixed by the Executive Committee or in the By Laws. No AFF State of the Executive except on the approval of the Executivity Committee.

The Historian shall collect and home serve historical data relating to the campaigns and to the periods of ometer activaties of the Fifth Army Corps and shall prepare from time to time such nematicals, obituaries, and histories of the Fifth Army Corps and of its components and hambers as may be of value and interest to the Society.

The Secretary shall have changed the correspondence of the Society, the records of its membership and of the society and by Laws. All applications for membership shall be finally applications for the attention and action of the committee on Membership, and he shall give such evidence of membership as shall file prescribed by the Executive committee.

The Executive Committee shall shall gen eral charge and supervision of the affairs and business of the Society, the auxiliting of accounts, the direction of publicity, the solicitation of member only, the enforcement of the provisions of the constitution and by laws, expenditures of the funds of the Society, the general direction of its activities at the further duties as may be prescribed from time to time.

SECTION VI : ELIGIBILITY OF OFFICERS, TERMS OF OFFICE AND ELECTION PRO-

Any member of the Society shall be eligible to appointment or election as an officer of the Society, except that an honorary president shall be an officer who has commanded the Wth Corps or higher unit of which the Wth Corps has been a component part or any distinguished member of the society. The first officers of the Society shall be elected by the members of the Society at the first meeting to be called by the Commanding General of the Fifth Army Corps and shall hold office until January 1, 1920; and thereafter the term of office shall be for one year, commencing January 1st of each year, except that honorary presidents shall hold office for the term of five years.

It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to hold general elections on the 11th day of November each year for the election of officers, provision to be made in By Laws for participation either in person or by proxy of all non-bers of the Society in such elections. The manner of notification, the method of nomination and the procedure of election, and the method of determination and dociaration of results of such election shall be prescribed by the Executive Committee in By Laws.

SECTION VII: APPOINTMENT AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES:

The Executive Committee shall appoint from among the members a nomination committee for the purpose of nominating candidates for the offices prescribed herein; A Membership Committee to solicit members and to increase the membership of the Society; A Publicity Committee for the advancement of the interests of the Society by the employment of suitable advertising etc.; An Auditing Committee to audit the accounts of the Society and of the Treasurer; A Committee on Constitution and By Laws of the Society, to formulate amendments to the constitution and to make by-laws and propose amendments to the same. The work of these Committees shall be supervised by the Executive Committee.

SECTION VIII: HEADQUARTERS.
The Executive Cormittee shall select and maintain Headquarters for the Society.

SECTION IX: FEES AND FINANCES:
The initial fees for membership in this Society shall be as follows: For commissioned officers of all grades and field clerks, five (5) francs when paid in the A.E.F. and One (1) dollar when paid in the United States or elsewhere; For enlisted men of all grades one (1) franc when paid in the A.E.F. and twenty five cents when paid in the United States or elsewhere. The annual dues shall be such amount as ray be determined by the Executive Committee, not to exceed Two (\$2.00) Dollars, and shall be the same for all members. The initial fee shall cover the membership for the first year of the Society's organization. Voluntary contributions of money in addition to the fees may be received by the Society.

SECTION X: Vacancies in offices will be filled by appointments to be made by the Executive Committee.

SECTION XI: The Executive Cornittee shall have authority to appoint such agencies for the carrying out of the objects and purposes of the Society, the collections of fees and the obtaining of members, as the exigencies of the Service, during the present war, may require. In this connection the Executive Committee shall arrange for and establish local organizations of members whose general purpose shall be the same as prescribed in this constitution for the Society.

SECTION XII : Amendments to the constitution may be adopted at any amual meeting of this society by a majority of the credited delegates thereto.

SECTION XIII: That the Society adopt a distinctive button to be worn by its members.
