PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS,

It becomes evermore important, as the world's affairs assume increased complexity, that the Minnesota news media be prepared to fulfill journalism's traditional obligation of keeping its citizenry fully and accurately informed, and

WHEREAS,

it is vital to the people's welfare that those who enter the profession of journalism do so imbued with the journalist's credo of the public journal as a public trust, accepting a full measure of responsibility as trustees for the public, and

WHEREAS,

Minnesota scholastic publications play an increasingly important role in the preparation of young men and women to be professional journalists of the future, and

WHEREAS,

scholastic publications also continue to serve as an immediate training ground for youths in the exercise of the highest type of responsible citizenship through the opportunities afforded for the insulation of American ideals of democracy and international good will.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 24 - 27, 1968, as

"MINNESOTA SCHOLASTIC JOURNALISM WEEK"

and urge the citizens to acquaint themselves with the purposes, achievements and goals of scholastic journalism.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight, and of the State, the one hundred tenth.
