PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the crippling effects of multiple sclerosis, or MS, on young adults in the 20 through 30 age group is a problem of increasing concern to the citizens of Minnesota, where there are over 7,000 victims afflicted with this disease of the central nervous system, and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota North Star Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society helps support scientific research to find the cause and cure of this chronic, disabling disease, and further, gives aid to MS patients and their families, and

WHEREAS, public support of the program of the Multiple Sclerosis chapter is essential to the welfare of those citizens who are crippled or rendered helpless by multiple sclerosis,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Mother's Day to Father's Day, 1968, as

"IN HORN CHEST MOUTH"

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to support the 1968 campaign of the Multiple Sclerosis chapter.
