EXECUTIVE ORDER

PROCLAMATION.

The Legislature in 1913 passed a law designating "the Governor to issue annually a proclamation designating the third Tuesday in June as Good Roads Day and requesting the people of the State to contribute labor, material and money toward the improvement of public highways in their respective communities upon that day."

By reason of the submission to the people by the last Legislature, of the question of amending our Constitution so as to secure the permanent preservation of our highways, there has been a great increase of interest in the construction of good roads and a consequent increase in the waste of millions occasioned by their present condition.

WHEREFORE, I, Joseph A. Burnquist, Governor of Minnesota, declaring that improved highways are one of the State's greatest needs, do hereby designate

JUNE 17, 1916,

as

GOOD ROADS DAY

and urge that on said day the people of our State comply with the legislative enactment above quoted and that on and from said day, until next election, every effort be made to call the attention of our voters to the necessity of adopting the proposed Constitutional amendment to which reference has heretofore been made.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereto caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed and have hereunto set my hand this thirty-first day of May, 1916, at the Capitol, in the city of St. Paul.
