


I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, hereby certify that as shown by the official returns made by the State Canvassing Board of July 3, 1919, duly certified to me by the Secretary of State, of the vote cast at the special election for congressman held July 1, 1919, in the Fourth Congressional District, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Carl C. Van Dyke;

Oscar E. Keller was declared to have received the highest number of votes for the office of Congressman for the Fourth Congressional District and duly declared elected to that office.
