WHEREAS, for one hundred and eighty-one years the Constitution of the United States has been the symbol of man's capacity to govern himself, and

WHEREAS, from its wisdom have flowed growing concepts of liberty, justice, and human dignity, and

WHEREAS, the Constitution is still the certain guarantee of our basic rights, it is still the promise of protection from government -- and by government, and

WHEREAS, liberty is a blessing that must be constantly nurtured, and in this rapidly changing world every American must understand the system of government by which we live -- and for which so many have died,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 15, 1968, as


"CITIZENSHIP DAY"

"CONSTITUTION WEEK"


