PROCLAMATION

WIEREAS, the State of Minnesota is engaged in the greatest roadbuilding program in its history, a program destined to give its citizens and visitors the safest, most officient transportation system possible; and

WIEREAS, the dependency of the Stat's economy on its 126,000 miles of roads, atreets, and highways has been clearly established by the continued increase of motor vehicle traffic; and

WILREAS, the direct benefits to the highway user of the construction of adequate highways are recognized to exceed their cost and the additional upgrading of property values, the creation of industrial, commercial and residentall sites accessible to good highways, the reduction of human suffering be reducing accidents, and the joy and pleasure of motoring on safe highways, are all extra dividends; and

WIENEAS, the increasing need for better highways of adequate capacity to meet and ever increasing traffic domands requires the understanding and support of all our citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVandor, as Governor of the State of Hinnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of September 22-28, 1968 as

"HICHWAY WEEK"

nad urge all of the citizens of Minnesota to consider during this time the vital role of highways in their daily lives.
