PROCLAMATION

MEREAS. December 15, 1968 marks the 177th anniversary of the adoption of the Bill of Rights - the first 10 amendments to the Constitution of the United States; and

WEREAS, the guarantees contained in the Bill of Rights are intended to protect and preserve the civil liberties and personal freedom of all Americans; and

MIEREAS, we chould remember those responsible for the addition of the Bill of Rights to the federal constitution, George Mason, Thomas Jefferson and James Madison; and

WHEREAS, Americans should renew their understanding of their history and visit historical shrines related to the founding of our nation- George Mason's Cunston Hall, Thomas Jefferson's Monticello and Ceorge Washington's Mount Vernon

NOW, THEREFORE, I. Harold LeVander, Covernor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, December 15, as

"SILL OF RIGHTS DAY"

in Minnepota and urge all Americans to reflect on their heritage, their rights and responsibilities and to foster maintenance of the Bill of Rights.

IN WITHESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-cight, and of the State, the one hundred eleventh.
