PROCLAMATION.

As we depended primarily upon those who labor for the success of our arms in the days of war, so now, when the conflict is over, we must in like manner depend upon them for the future welfare of our country.

Especially at this time of unrest throughout the world, it is well that a day should be set aside to enable our workers to meet for the purpose of discussing the problems of our country and of aiding in their solution.

THEREFORE, Monday, September 1, 1919, is hereby designated as

LABOR DAY

and proclaimed as a holiday throughout the State and all of our citizens are urged to manifest such an interest in labor as will tend to harmony and co-operation among our people and to the stability and progress of our state and nation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereto caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed and have hereunto set my hand at the Capitol, in the City of Saint Paul, this thirtieth day of August, 1919.
