## STATE OF MINNESOTA EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. PROCLAMATION. In accordance with an announcement at the time of the reception to the One Hundred Fifty-first Field Artillery and pursuant to telegram to the American Legion on September first, I desire to proclaim November 11, 1919, as Armistice Day. On the anniversary of the Armistice, it is exceedingly fitting that the citizens of Minnesota should hold, in honor of all service men, the largest patriotic demonstration in its history. On that date the American Legion will meet in national convention within the borders of our Commonwealth. This gathering

On that date the American Legion will meet in national convention within the borders of our Commonwealth. This gathering should be made the occasion for the wide promulgation of the American principles for which this organization stands.

The Sunday preceding Armistice Day is a fitting time for churches and religious organizations to hold appropriate services in memory of those who served during the World War and for the dedication of such suitable memorials as will perpetuate their patriotism for the inspiration of future generations.

THEREFORE, I, Joseph A. A. Burnquist, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby designate

and urge that said day and the Sunday immediately preceding be observed as herein requested.
