WHEREAS, our national image and position of world leadership are greatly enhanced by the more attractive and enjoyable, healthier and safer environment in which our people live and work in the American way of life, and

WHEREAS, the arts and skills of the professional painter and decorator today and throughout our nation's history have contributed greatly to the preservation, health, safety, enjoyment and effective use of our nation's homes, schools, institutions, factories, stores, market places and military facilities, and

WHEREAS, this long and outstanding contribution to the protection and beautification of this great nation should not go unnoticed and unrecognized,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of June 14 - 21, 1969 as

"NATIONAL PAINTING AND DECORATING WEEK"

in Minnesota.
