It is well, therefore, that a day be set aside for thanksgiving and prayer in order that we may more fully realize the many gracious gifts that we continually receive and express our deep gratitude to Him, whom we recognize as the source of all our blessings.

Let us, on the day so set apart, thank God for the peace of righteous victory and for the growth of democracy throughout the world. Let us be grateful to Him for our American government and for the liberties and opportunities for which it stands. Let us express our appreciation of the prosperity of the Nation and strive for the spirit of good-will and co-operation among our people. Let us be thankful for all the numerous bounties vouchsafed to us during the past year.

NOW THEREFORE, I, J.A.A. Burnquist, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

T H U R S D A Y

NOVEMBER 27, 1919

as a day of thanksgiving and call upon the people of Minnesota to suspend their usual daily activities for the purpose of gathering in their homes, churches and other places of meeting to observe in a spirit of thankfulness and praise the day so designated.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have heretofore caused the Great Seal of Minnesota to be affixed and have hereunto set my hand at the Capitol, in the City of Saint Paul, this nineteenth day of November, 1919.
