PROCLAMATION



- WHEREAS, it is vital to the people's welfare that those who enter the profession of journalism do so imbued with the journalist's credo of the public journal as a public trust, accepting a full measure of responsibility as trustees for the public, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota scholastic publications play an increasingly important role in the preparation of young men and women to be professional journalists of the future, and
- WHEREAS, scholastic publications also continue to serve as an immediate training ground for youth in the exercise of the highest type of responsible citizenship through the opportunities afforded for the inculcation of American ideals of democracy and international good will,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 21 - 26, 1969 as

in Minnesota, and urge its citizens to acquaint themselves with the purpose, achievements and goals of scholastic journalism.


