PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the creativity and intellectual self-reliance of every individual as well as his vocational competence are developed by education, and

WHEREAS, the need of young America is for able, dedicated, well-educated, professional teachers who will prepare them for the demands of an age which wants good schools, general education for citizenship, as well as academic and technical education for the role today's student will play tomorrow as a working adult, and

WHEREAS, teachers of the nation and the State of Minnesota are thus in a position of high responsibility for the public and personal welfare of the nation and its citizens,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the Month of April, 1969, as

"TEACHING CAREER MONTH"

in Minnesota in order to recognize the importance of the work accomplished by the teachers of this country and to elicit the public support necessary to encourage them to continue in this work.
