



At a special meeting of the village council of the Village of Lastrup, in the County of Morrison, and State of Minnesota, held in the Fire House in said village, on the 8th day of January A. D. 1920, at the hour of 9 o'clock, P. M., at which meeting all members of the said village council were present, Trustee Henry Stroeing offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"BE IT RESOLVED by the village council of the Village of Lastrup, in the County of Morrison and State of Minnesota, in special session duly assembled, all members thereof being present and voting, that the following question, to-wit; "Shall the Village of Lastrup be separated from the townships of Buh and Granite, thereby to become and constitute a separate election and assessment and district?" be submitted to the qualified electors of the said village for their determination, at a special election for said village to be held in the Fire House in said Village of Lastrup on the 20th day of January A. D. 1920, between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon of said day and five o'clock in the afternoon of said day, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said special election for said purpose be so held at the time and place herein before stated, and that the clerk of said village cause notice of said special election to be duly given as provided by law, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ballots to be used at said special election shall read as follows, to-wit: "Shall the Village of Lastrup be separated from the townships of Buh and Granite, thereby to become and constitute a separate election and assessment district?" Yes _____

MINUTES OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

At a special election of the Village of Lastrup, in the County of Morrison, and State of Minnesota, held at the Fire House, being the place where it was directed to be held by the village council, after giving due notice thereof as provided by law, on the 20th day of January A. D. 1920, F. W. Buessler and Franz Mullner two qualified electoral voters of said village to act as judges of said election and one qualified voter of said village to act as clerk of said election, each of whom had within ten (10) days before said time been designated and appointed by said village council to act as judges and clerk, respectively, of said election, who, being present at the hour of nine (9) o'clock A. M. , each of them duly took and subscribed the oath to faithfully discharge the duties required of them at said election, and the said judges and clerks being duly qualified, forthwith opened the poles by proclamation, and the election proceeded without intermission or adjournment until closed.

The subject voted on at said special election as stated in the notice was "Shall the Village of Lastrup be separated from the townships of Buh and Granite, thereby to become and constitute a separate election and assessment district?"

At five (5) o'clock in the afternoon of said day the poles were closed, proclamation thereof having been made by one of the judges thirty (30) minutes previous thereto. The judges then proceeded to publicly canvass and count the votes, and a true statement thereof was proclaimed to the voters by the clerk of election.

The following is a true statement of the results of the counting and canvassing of the votes by ballot at the special election at the Village of Lastrup, County of Morrison, State of Minnesota, held on the

20th day of January A. D. 1920, as proclaimed to the voters by the clerk of election: 16 votes were cast in favor of separation from the townships of Buh and Granite. No votes were cast against separation from the townships of Buh and Granite.
