

P R O C L A M A T I O N

WHEREAS, Our police officers of America have worked devotedly and selflessly in behalf of the people of this Nation to protect our unalienable rights of Life, Liberty and the pursuit of happiness guaranteed by the Constitution against the increasing challenges to freedom at many fronts; and

WHEREAS, our first line of defense against the erosion of freedom is our law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, These officers have safeguarded the lives and property of their fellow Minnesotans, regardless of the peril or hazard to themselves; and

WHEREAS, by the enforcement of our laws these same officers have given our State unusual freedom from fear of the violence and civil disorder that continue to afflict other nations and has left her blithely upon this vast frontier; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota has been significantly honored by the election of Richard Poldor of our St. Paul Police Department and the President of the Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association to the office of President of the 225,000 member International Conference of Police Associations; and

WHEREAS, All these men and women in the law enforcement profession by their patriotic service and their dedicated efforts have earned the gratitude of their fellow Minnesotans.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of May 11-17, 1969, as

"POLICE WEEK"

and, in honor of the wonderful, state and federal officers who have been killed or disabled on the line of duty, further proclaim Thursday, May 15, 1969, as

"PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY"

in Minnesota, and strongly urge our citizens to take advantage of this opportunity to honor the police and peace officers of their community and to provide a better base of understanding of their daily responsibilities.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fifth day of April in the year of our Lord the one thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, and of the State, the one hundred eleventh.
