Government Lot two sec.53 twp.101-R22. and

S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec 32, twp.101-R22. "

The Total number of votes cast at said election was Sixty One (61), and the following number of votes were cast for and against said proposition as canvassed by us to-wit:-

There were cast for detaching-Thirty three (33) votes.

There were cast against detaching twenty eight (28), and so said land was detached from said village of Emmons.
