

REPORT OF ANNUAL ELECTION.

At the annual Town Meeting of the Town of Buckman, in the County of Morrison, and State of Minnesota, held at the Buckman Village Hall, being the place where it was directed to be held by resolution of the Town Board, after giving due notice thereof as provided by law, on the 28th day of February, 1920, and the judges and Clerk of said Town Board being present at the hour of nine o'clock A. M., each of them duly took and subscribed the oath to faithfully discharge the duties required of them at said election, and the said judges and clerk being duly qualified, forthwith opened the poles by proclamation, and the election proceeded without intermission or adjournment until closed.

One of the subjects voted on at said meeting as stated in the notice was "Shall the town separate from the Village?"

At five (5) o'clock in the afternoon of said day the poles were closed, proclamation thereof having been made by one of the judges thirty (30) minutes previous thereto. The judges then proceeded to publicly canvass and count the votes, and a true statement thereof was proclaimed to the voters by the Clerk of election.

The following is a true statement of the results of the counting and canvassing of the votes by ballot at the said meeting at the Buckman Village Hall, County of Morrison, State of Minnesota, held on the 9th day of March A.D. 1920, as proclaimed to the voters by the Clerk of election: 95 votes were cast in favor of separation from the Village of Buckman, and 27 votes were cast against separation from said village.
