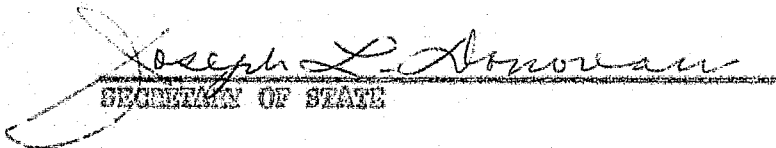
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 15, 1969, as

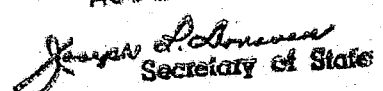
"POETRY DAY"
