PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, children with special learning disabilities exhibit a disorder in one or more of the basic psychological processes involved in understanding or using spoken or written language, and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Association for Children With Learning Disabilities is a non-profit organization dedicated to alert the public to the special problems and pursue early diagnosis and remediation of the growing needs of these children, and

WHEREAS, the first state-wide conference on learning disabilities in Minnesota will be held in Minneapolis, September 19-20, 1969, under the sponsorship of the Minnesota Association for Children With Learning Disabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 14-20, 1969, as

"LEARNING DISABILITIES WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge all parents, educators and physicians, to focus their special attention on early recognition and swift remediation for these children, so that they may take their rightful position among tomorrow's human resources.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, and of the State, the one hundred twelve.
