WHEREAS, the President of the United States has proclaimed the week of October 5 - 11, 1969, as FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, and

WHEREAS, the needless loss of lives and property as a result of fire could be significantly reduced by individual and community fire prevention programs, and

WHEREAS, professional and volunteer members of the fire service and other public agencies in combining their talents and efforts insure a successful fight against those conditions which cause fires, and


WHEREAS, each citizen must earnestly desire to provide a fire-safe place in which to live and work by eliminating those fire hazards which cause the loss of life, property, employment and the resources by which we exist;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronald LaFollette, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate the week of October 5 - 11, 1969, as


FIRE PREVENTION WEEK
