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Ordinance Annexing Addition of Lots and Blocks and Other Un-platted Tracts To The Village of Clearbrook.

The Village Council of the Village of Clearbrook do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the following described lots and blocks and other un-platted tracts, viz:

All of block one (1), Peterson's Addition to Clearbrook, Clearwater county, Minnesota, as the same appears on file and of record in the office of the register of Deeds for Clearwater county, Minnesota;

Beginning at the iron monument that is located thirty-five (35) feet south by thirty-five (35) feet east of the southeast corner of Lot six (6), of Block fifteen (15), Original Townsite of Clearbrook, Clearwater Co., Minn., as the same appears on file and of record in the office of the register of deeds for said county, thence due south for a distance of three hundred thirty-five (335) feet, thence due west for distance of five hundred sixty-five [565] feet, thence due north for a distance of three hundred thirty-five [335] to a point thirty-five [35] feet due south of the southeast corner of Lot seven [7], of Block seven [7], of said Original Townsite, thence due east for a distance of five hundred sixty-five (565) feet to the point of beginning, said described tract being a part of the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter [SE 1/4 SW 1/4] of section twenty-nine [29], of Township one hundred forty-nine (149), north of Range thirty-seven [37], west of the Fifth Principal Meridian, in Clearwater county, Minnesota, and containing four and thirty four hundredths [4.34] acres.

Beginning at a point two hundred ninety-five [295] feet due south of the southwest corner of Lot seven [7], of Block seven [7], Original Townsite of Clearbrook, Clearwater county, Minnesota, as the same appears on file and of record in the office of the register of deeds for said Clearwater county, thence due south for a distance of seventy-five [75] feet, thence due east for a distance of one hundred forty [140] feet, thence due north for a distance of seventy-five [75] feet, thence due west for a distance of one hundred forty [140] feet to the point of beginning, same being a part of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter [SW 1/4 SW 1/4] of section twenty-nine [29], of Township one hundred forty-nine [149], north of Range thirty-seven [37], west of the Fifth Principal Meridian, in Clearwater county, Minnesota, and containing twenty four hundredths [0.24] of an acre.

All of which said above described tracts and parcels of real property abutt upon the incorporated Village of Clearbrook, be and the same are hereby annexed to such village, and shall become a part of such village as effectually as if they, and each of them, has been originally a part thereof.

ness, said office being equipped with the necessary material (excepting news-

paper press) and skilled workmen for preparing and printing the same in whole

or in part in said *Village* and County where said newspaper is dated;

that at each regular issue thereof during all the time aforesaid, there were print-

ed, published and delivered not less than two hundred and forty (240) complete

copies of such publication to paying subscribers; that prior to the date of the first

publication of said notice, the publishers of said newspaper filed in the office of

the County Auditor of said County of *Clearwater* the affidavit

required by Chapter 33 of the General Laws of Minnesota, 1893, as amended.

Deponent further says that for more than one year next proceeding the date of

the first publication, and during the time of the publication of said notice, said

newspaper has been admitted to the United States mail as second-class mail

matter; and now continues to be so received.
