

PROCLAMATION


- WHEREAS, a community, state, or nation is only as strong as its schools, and the schools are only as strong as the people of the community, state, or nation strive to make them; and
- WHEREAS, each person in each of his public and private capacities has a direct responsibility to understand, support, and improve the schools; and
- WHEREAS, each child of the more than one million school age children in Minnesota has a right to a quality education relevant to his abilities, background, and goals and designed to help him become a citizen capable of functioning fully within the range of his unique talents; and
- WHEREAS, the public schools serve to promote academic knowledge, vocational preparation, cultural enrichment, development of individual confidence and character, enlightened citizenship, and creative thinking for each individual in a society that seeks to improve the quality of life for all mankind.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby designate November 9 - 15, 1969

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to renew their efforts to learn about the progress and possibilities of our education system and to help our schools reach their goal: the best possible education for all.


