A PETITION FOR CALLING AN ELECTION FOR DETERMINATION
OF THE PROPOSED INCORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF
NIELSVILLE, POLK COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners in and for Polk
County, Minnesota.

Gentlemen:-

We, the undersigned, who are twenty-five or more of the
voters residing within the territory hereinafter described in
compliance with the provisions of sections 1304 and 1305 of Chapter
9 of the General Statutes of Minnesota, for the year of 1913, and
acts amendatory and supplemental to said sections respectfully
petition the Board of County Commissioners of Polk County, Minn-
nesota, that being the county in which the whole of said lands
hereinafter described are situated, to call an election for the
determination of proposed incorporation of the territory herein-
after described to become the village of Nielsville, Polk County,
Minnesota. We respectfully represent that we have caused to be
taken a census of the resident population of the territory herein-
after described which said census is hereto attached and made as
much a part of this petition as if the same were herein fully
written and have found that the number of actual residents living
within the territory hereinafter described to be 150.
