- WHEREAS, a significant segment of Minnesota agricultural economy is derived from Pork and Pork Production, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota's Pork industry also ranks among the leaders in the nation--second in hogs slaughtered and Pich both in hogs produced and marketed, and
- WHEREAS, many thousands of Minnesota citizens derive their livelihood from the raising of swine to the processing and selling of pork products, and
- WHEREAS, there is a continuous program by the producers and the processors to improve the high quality of lean and tender pork cuts, and
- WHEREAS, all consumers can enjoy the highly nutritious and tasty pork products offered by the pork industry,
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim January 30-31, 1970, as

and do encourage all citizens of our great State to enjoy pork and pork products, and urge all civic and business organizations, schools, distributors, retailers and the news media to unite in promoting Minnesota-produced pork.
