

P R O C L A M A T I O N


- WHEREAS, the engineering profession had distinguished itself through significant contributions to the progress and development of industry, transportation and communications; and


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of February 23 - 28, 1970, as
