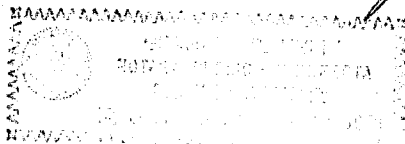

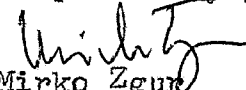

To all, whom it may concern:
Satisfactory evidence having been exhibited to me
that *Walter J. Rusk*

has been appointed Consul of the Socialist Federal Republic of
Yugoslavia at Chicago, Illinois, for the States of Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan,
Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, and Wisconsin.

I do hereby recognize him, as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such
functions, powers, and privileges as are allowed to the Consuls of the most
favored nations in the United States.

In testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the
United States to be hereunto affixed.

Done, at the City of Washington, this nineteenth day of October,
in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, and of the
Independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and nineteenth.
