- WHEREAS, Minnesota richly blessed with over 15,00 lakes and 25,000 miles of streams and waterways is reminded that waters, our most precious resource, can be polluted and lost in devastating floods, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota once known as the Iron Ore Capital of the Nation has been granted a respite from a sagging mining industry through the utilization of taconite and further buoyed by copper-nickel development, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota, the pride of the hunters and sportsmen through all the years, is turning to programs of wetlands acquisition, wildlife management and lake and stream improvement, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota, a natural outdoor playground, has finally embarked on an ambitious state park program of acquisition and development, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota on statehood was crowned with seemingly limitless forests of White pine, norways and hardwoods,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 18 to April 28 as
