PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, It is fitting and proper that time be set aside in our busy lives as Americans to honor the original human inhabitants us this great land, a period set aside to properly thank the American Indian people for giving us the opportunity to occupy this virgin and resource-rich land of American; and

it is equally essential that we take time to recognize with humility WHEREAS, the harshness of humanity in our treament of our Christian brethren and to renew our pledge to go forward as borthers of mankind, fully recognizing their values and sharing our virtues for the betterment of future generations; and

WHEREAS. we must note on this occasion the sacrifices that were made by the true American, the Minnesota American Indian, in their contributions to our society and recognize the need for fulfilling the plegge to unite our cultures, thus combining the strength of our mutual and respective virtueses a guiding factor in moving forward together to make America a better place for all to live; and

WHEREAS, we plead for divine guidance and for human understanding and for compassion in achieveng this goal; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnepota, do hereby proclaim the week beginning May 4, 1970 as

AMERICAN INDIAN WEEK

and I further proclaim the day of May 10, 1970 as American Indian Day. Since that day is Nother's Day, it gives us an opportunity to honor American Indian mothers especially. I urge all Minnesotans to oppropriately observe this historicand significant period reserved to commemorate the contributions these first citizens have made, are making, and will continue to make for the enrichment of the quality of life for all mankind.
