- WHEREAS, these qualities must be further utilized as we build the future on the fundamental lessons of the past. Having learned to live with change and challenge, these senior citizens offer us their priceless emperience and mature judgement, and
- we are grateful for the scientific and technological advances which WHEREAS, have given us the longest life expectancy in the history of the world, but we must also be concerned with the quality of that longer life span, and
- the moral as well as the practical obligations domand that we excercise WHEREAS. the fullest measure of our responsibility to our older citizens, taking steps which stem from public awareness of the role and needs of senior citiznes - as we have done at this 1969 Legislative Session in providing urgent and significant tax relief for the retired elderly unreasonably penalized by the pressures of an inflated economy, and
- the President of these United States, Richard M. Nixon, has proclaimed WHEREAS, the month of May, 1970, as Senior Citizens Month, nation-wide, and has designated that the continuing theme for this special month is "Meeting The Challenge of the Later Years",

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levendor, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the Month of May, 1970, as
