WHEREAS, special recognition should be made of these highly esteemed women so they will know they are greatly loved and well appreciated, and

WHEREAS, grandmothers should be honored with a special day in the same way that mothers and fathers each have their remembrance days,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the second Sunday in October, October 11, 1970 as

GRANDMOTHERS' DAY

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to join in the observance with special recognition of grandmothers.
