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PETITION FOR ANNEXATION.

TO THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BUHL, ST. LOUIS  
COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

The undersigned respectfully petition and state to your  
Honorable Body, as follows, to-wit:

1st. That the five signers to this petition, namely; James  
T. Doherty, Frank Bullis, John A. Wadd, Alfred J. Wadd and  
Albert DeVries are residents and legal voters within the  
territory hereinafter described in Paragraph 2 of the Petition.

2nd. That the territory known as South one-half of the North  
one-half of Section 21 ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $N\frac{1}{2}$  Sec 21); the south one-half  
of Section 21 ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 21); the north one-half of Section  
29 ( $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 29); the south one-half of the south east  
one-quarter of Section 20 ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 20); the  
Northwest one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter of Section  
20, ( $NW\frac{1}{4}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 20); the Southwest one-quarter of Section  
20, ( $SW\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 20); Section Nineteen (Sec 19); Section Eighteen  
(Sec. 18); North one-half of Section Seventeen ( $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 17);  
all in Township Fifty eight North of Range Nineteen West of the  
Fourth Principal Meridian; also the South one-half of Section  
Thirteen (13) and Section Twenty four (24), both in Township  
Fifty eight (58) North of Range Twenty (20) West of Fourth  
Principal Meridian.

3rd. That the foregoing described territory adjoins the Village  
of Buhl, St. Louis County, Minnesota, and no part of the same  
is more than one and one-half (1 1/2) miles from the present  
limits of the said Village of Buhl.

4th. That the said Village of Buhl at the present time is  
on the following described lands, to-wit: The southwest one-  
quarter of Northwest one-quarter of Section Fifteen ( $SW\frac{1}{4}$  of  
 $NW\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 15); the West one-half of Southeast one-quarter  
of Northwest one-quarter of Section Fifteen ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of  
 $NW\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 15); the Southwest one-quarter of Section Fifteen  
( $SW\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 15); South one-half of North one-half of Section  
Sixteen ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 16); the South one-half of Sixteen  
( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 16); the south one-half of Section Seventeen  
( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 17); the north one-half of Section 20 ( $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 20);  
Northeast one-quarter of Southeast one-quarter of Section Twenty,  
( $NE\frac{1}{4}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 20); North one-half of North one-half of  
Section Twenty-one ( $N\frac{1}{2}$  of  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Sec 21); North one-half of  
Northwest one-quarter of Section Twenty two, ( $N\frac{1}{2}$  of  $NW\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec  
22) all in Township Fifty eight (58) North of Range Nineteen  
(19) West of Fourth Principal Meridian.

5th. That the three (3) petitioners, namely: James T. Doherty,  
Frank Bullis and John A. Wadd took an accurate census of the  
population residing in the territory described in Paragraph  
Two (2) of this Petition, and found the number of inhabitants  
residing thereon to be over seventy-five (75) namely; ninety  
five (95).

6th. That the said census was taken by them within four (4) weeks of the petition, on namely the 1st and 2nd days of September, 1920.

7th. That the boundary of the territory described in Paragraph 2 of this Petition is as follows, to-wit:

Commencing on the northern boundary of the present limits of said Village of Buhl, at the East one-sixteenth (E 1/16) corner of the Northeast one-quarter of Section Seventeen in Township Fifty eight Range 19 West (E 1/16 of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec 17, Twp 58 R. 19 W) and running in a northerly direction to the Northeast corner of said Section Seventeen (NE Cor of Sec 17); thence running in a westerly direction to the Northwest corner of Section Eighteen (18) in said Township Fifty eight (58) Range Nineteen (19) West; thence running in a southerly direction to the West one-quarter corner of said section eighteen (18); thence running in a westerly direction to the West one-quarter corner of Section Thirteen (13) in Township Fifty eight (58) Range Twenty (20) West; thence running in a southerly direction to the Southwest corner of Section Twenty-four (24) in Township Fifty eight (58) Range Twenty (20) West; thence running in an easterly direction to the Southeast corner of said Section twenty-four (24); thence running in an easterly direction to the southeast corner of Section Nineteen (19) in Township Fifty eight (58) North Range Nineteen (19) West; thence running in a southerly direction to the West one-quarter corner of Section Twenty nine (29) in said Township Fifty eight (58) North of Range Nineteen (19) West; thence running in an Easterly direction to the East one-quarter corner of said Section Twenty-nine (29); thence running in a northerly direction to the Northeast corner of said Section Twenty nine (29); thence running in an easterly direction to the Southeast corner of Section Twenty one (21) in said Township Fifty eight (58) North of Range Nineteen (19) West; thence running in a northerly direction to the East one-sixteenth corner of Northeast one-quarter of said Section twenty one (21); thence running in a westerly direction along the southern boundary line of the present limits of the said Village of Buhl, to the West one-sixteenth corner of the Northwest one-quarter of said Section twenty-one (21); thence running in a southerly direction to the east one-sixteenth corner of the Southeast one-quarter of Section Twenty (20) in Township Fifty eight (58) North of Range Nineteen (19) West; thence running in a westerly direction to the center one-sixteenth corner of Southeast one-quarter of said Section Twenty (20); thence running in a northerly direction to the north one-sixteenth corner of southeast one-quarter of said section twenty (20); thence running in a westerly direction to the west one-quarter corner of said section twenty (20); thence running in a northerly direction to the west one-quarter corner of section seventeen (17) in Township Fifty eight (58) North of Range Nineteen (19) West; thence running in an easterly direction to the east one-quarter corner of said section seventeen (17); thence running in an northerly direction to the east one-sixteenth corner of the northeast one-quarter of said Section Seventeen (17) which was the point of beginning.

8th. That the quantity of land embraced in the territory described in Paragraph 2 of this petition is Two thousand seven hundred eighty seven and 26/100 (2787.26) acres, more or less, and the number of actual residents thereon are ninety five (95).

9th. That a true and correct copy of the said census taken of the resident population of the said territory is hereto attached and marked Exhibit "A".

WHEREFORE, The undersigned petition your Honorable Body to call an election for the purpose of determining whether or not the territory described in Paragraph Two (2) of this Petition shall be annexed to the said Village of Buhl.
