

NOTICE

You are hereby notified that at a duly authorized SPECIAL ELECTION held in the Village of Farmington, Dakota County, and State of Minnesota, on September 21st. 1920, the following question was voted upon, Viz :

"Shall the Village of Farmington separate from the Township of Empire in all things and become a separate Election and Assessment District".

From the returns made by the election board and canvassed by the Village Council acting as a canvassing board, the result of said election was declared to be as follows :

Total number of votes cast at said Special Election was 129, and that there were Seventy-two (72) "YES" votes and there were Fifty-seven (57) "NO" votes, and no blank ballots, and the result of the election was that the question carried.

You are hereby notified that pursuant to Section 1238 General Statutes 1913, the Village of Farmington is now a separate election and assessment district, duly approved by me, subject of course to what action you may take.
