PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, every year millions of motorists find that the worn-out automobile battery that worked fine in the summer months fails them with the arrival of winter; and
- WHEREAS, this results in a tremendous loss of productive man hours due to employees being late or absent from work, important appointments missed; and
- WHEREAS, cars stalled on busy thoroughfares represent a distinct safety hazard to other roadway users; and
- WHEREAS, the stranded motorist often incurs considerable expense for an emergency service call; and
- WHEREAS, the car owner is not aware of the condition of his battery in most cases;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 5, 1970 as

TEST YOUR BATTERY WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge that all batteries be checked and serviced before failures occur.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this sixth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy, and of the State, the one hundred thirteenth.
