PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, children with special learning disabilities exhibit a disorder in one or more of the basic learning processes involved in understanding or using spoken or written language, and

WHEREAS, The Minnesota Association for Children with Learning Disabilities is a non-profit organization dedicated to alert the public to the special problems and pursue early diagnosis and remediation of the pressing needs of these children, and

WHEREAS, the second state-wide conference on learning disabilities in Minnesota will be held in Minneapolis, October 2-3, 1970, under the sponsorship of the Minnesota Association for Children with Learning Disabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 27 through October 3, 1970, as

LEARNING DISABILITIES WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all parents, educators and physicians to focus their special attention on early recognition and seek remediation for these children, so that they may take their rightful position among tomorrow's human resources.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and seventy, and of the State, the one hundred thirteenth.
