PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the right to choose one's occupation is a basic American freedom, and the discovery and development of one's talents is essential to personal fulfillment, and to the continuing success of the American way of life, and

WHEREAS, many of our nation's social and economic problems arise from the frustration of persons in their attempts to achieve their creative and economic potentials, and

WHEREAS, the structure of occupations is rapidly changing, and new categories of employment for professionals, technicians, and sub-professionals are being created, so that most persons now entering the employment market will make from one to three occupational changes in their lifetime, and

WHEREAS, vocational guidance has proved to be a vital link between the increasingly complex world of work and the individual's need to select, locate and train for employment that is agreeable and rewarding.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Leander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 25-31, 1970, as

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe the week by making themselves better acquainted with the services offered by professional counselors and the extent to which each citizen can benefit from these services.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy, and of the state, the one hundred thirteenth.
