

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, this year marks the Golden Anniversary of American Education Week; and

WHEREAS, the first fifty years of this annual observance have helped create a cooperative attitude between educators and an informed public; and

WHEREAS, a constant advancement of all programs in the area of education is in keeping with the traditional use of our schools as a means of producing a well-informed citizenry, and is the concern of all; and

WHEREAS, local control of schools is paramount to the success of our system of education, allowing adaptability of curriculum to fit needs of the community, its students and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota long has been in the forefront of the national education scene with the high caliber of its educators, its schools and its students; and

WHEREAS, an informed citizenry makes possible continued planning and advancement in this matter of vital concern to all Minnesotans; and

WHEREAS, the theme of American Education Week is "Shaping Schools for the '70s";

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 25 through October 31, 1970 as

AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all residents to visit their schools, meet with their educators, examine the education structures in their communities so that they can contribute to the vital education of our youth and adults. School patrons must be involved so that a constructive interest in this critical area will be stimulated and advanced. Such involvement will assure a continuing program of leadership in education.
